Third Step to Heaven – <u>Exile</u> <u>Greek word: *xeniteia* means</u> <u>"living as a stranger"</u>

Exile means leaving all that one finds familiar.

We leave forever everything in our own county that prevents us from reaching the goal of Christian living

Exile is a separation in order to totally hold onto God. An exile is like a fugitive.

Passages for Reflection

1) 1 Peter 2:11-12

11 Dear friends, I urge you, as foreigners and exiles, to abstain from sinful desires, which wage war against your soul. 12 Live such good lives among the pagans that, though they accuse you of doing wrong, they may see your good deeds and glorify God on the day he visits us.

Passages for Reflection 1) 1 Corinthians 15:33-34 33 Do not be deceived: "Evil company corrupts good habits." 34 Awake to righteousness, and do not sin; for some do not have the knowledge of God. I speak this to your shame.

Passages for Reflection

2) Hebrews 11:24-27

24 By faith Moses, when he became of age, refused to be called the son of Pharaoh's daughter, 25 choosing rather to suffer affliction with the people of God than to enjoy the passing pleasures of sin, 26 esteeming the reproach of Christ greater riches than the treasures in[a] Egypt; for he looked to the reward.

27 By faith he forsook Egypt, not fearing the wrath of the king; for he endured as seeing Him who is invisible.
