The Order of Consecration

Of a Church Temple



Malankara Orthodox Syrian Church

By the grace of God, this work was completed for the benefit of the English-speaking faithful through the Liturgical Resource Development (LRD) Committee of the South-West American Diocese.

This order for the consecration of a temple of the Holy Church is adapted primarily from the invaluable English translations of Corepiscopos Fr. Kurian Thottupuram. Additionally, some material has been incorporated and adapted from a Syriac manuscript for the order of consecration translated by His Eminence, Mor Ayub Sylvanus of the Syriac Orthodox Church, as well as material from other editions of the consecration service translated by the development team of LRD.

The Syriac tradition contains a number of versions of the service of consecration, some differing from each other in many aspects. As the primary translation by Fr. Kurian has been abridged and adapted from multiple Syriac texts, this order does not always align with the Syriac and Malayalam text most commonly used in the Malankara Orthodox Syrian Church at present. God willing, a full translation from the Syriac of this particular order will completed soon.

BLESSING OF THE FOUNDATION STONE

During this service, the bishop blesses and places a stone in the sanctuary to symbolize the Church being founded on Christ, the Chief Cornerstone (Eph. 2:20; Ps. 118:22–23; Is. 28:16) and Sure Foundation (Is. 28:16). Twelve stones cut from the foundation stone are also placed in the sanctuary, identifying the Holy Church as Israel, the people of God (comprised of twelve tribes in the Old Covenant), and established upon the faith delivered by Christ to the twelve apostles. The rite brings to our minds the Israelites, led by Joshua, crossing the River Jordan toward the land flowing with milk and honey promised them by the Lord. After crossing the river, Joshua built an altar for God, who commanded that twelve stones be laid to serve as an eternal memorial of God's deliverance of the twelve tribes of Israel (Josh. 4: 1–10).

Introductory Prayer

Make us worthy, O Lord God, to lay the foundation stone of this temple, and to place here these anointed stones with remembrance of Your holy apostles, and to sanctify them with the sign of the holy cross. May this become Your House, so that in it You may dwell. Grant that the lordly sacrifices and pure prayers may be offered in this place unceasingly, and in this place may Your holy name be blessed, our Lord and our God, now and always and forever. Amin.

Psalm of Repentance

[Psalm 51] Have mercy upon me, O God, in Your loving kindness;/ in the abundance of Your mercy blot out my sin.

Wash me thoroughly from my guilt and cleanse me from my sin./ For I acknowledge my fault and my sins are before me always.

Against You only have I sinned and done evil in Your sight, / that You may be justified in Your words and vindicated in Your judgment. / For I was born in guilt and in sin did my mother conceive me.

SEDRO

Bishop: Christ our God, the spiritual and fiery hosts invisibly exalt You. With trembling those with burning wings bless You. In the Church of the first-born the incorporeal servants acclaim You with the trice-holy hymn. You graciously willed that the earthly should praise and exult You in the glorious tent of Your Holy Church, which was prefigured by the tent built for Your honor by Moses in the wilderness. That tent was a shadow of Your Holy Church, which was adorned by You, the True Bridegroom, and was built upon the bones of Your beloved ones, and was upheld by the truth of those dear to You. In days of old, the holy prophets spoke of Your Church. One among them offered the sacrifice of fragrance for relief from flood and prefigured the mystery of Your sacrifice. Another went up to the mountain of the Amorites² to sacrifice his only son and prefigured the oblation of Your Holy Church. Jacob, the patriarch, erected a stone and anointed it with oil, and pledged his tithe and offerings; this signified the Holy Church. And another erected an altar on Mount Carmel, and as a prefiguration offered the sacrifice. O Lord, visit Your Holy Church. Fulfill Your word that You will be with us unto the end of the world. Look upon her with compassion and fill her with the provisions of Your treasury. Protect her from the deluge of battles. Rescue her from all difficulties and dangers. Extend her thread in all directions and to all places. Appoint in her teachers, true shepherds, priests, and deacons. Comfort the souls of our parents, our brothers and sisters, our teachers and leaders, our departed ones and all the faithful departed. We offer You praise and thanksgiving, now and always and forever.

People: Amin.

People: Blessed is He Who has come and is to come; Glory be to Him Who sent Him for our salvation, and may His mercy be upon us all, forever.

Bishop: Now in the time of the Incarnation of our Lord and God and Savior Jesus Christ, the Living Word of God, Who was incarnate of the Holy Virgin Mary, these things did come to pass in this manner. †

People: We believe and confess!

(The bishop reads from the Gospel of St. Matthew 16:13-20)

Bishop: † Peace be unto you all.

BLESSING of the STONES

Bishop: Christ our God, by Your grace and through the prayers of the apostles and all the saints, and in particular the intercessions of the Holy Virgin Mary, the Mother of God, and the supplications of Saint (*Name*), in whose name we establish this Church, bless † † † these stones.

The bishop anoints the stones with Holy Chrism (Myron) while saying this prayer:

Bishop: In order to become the dwelling of God, these stones which are placed as the foundation of this temple are anointed and purified from all stains of transgressions and blessed:

In the name of the † Father, and of the † Son, and of the † Holy Spirit, forever and ever.

People: Amin.

The bishop exalts the consecrated stones three times, saying:

Bishop: For the glory, honor, praise, and exaltation of the Holy Trinity, one in essence, and for the tranquility and building up of the Holy Church, these stones are exalted!

HYMN

For the glory and honor Of the Holy Trinity; For the peace and building up Of the Holy Church of God!

BLESSING of the FOUR CORNERS of the WORLD

This exaltation of the stones is optional if the consecration of the altar and temple is conducted immediately following the consecration of the foundation stone, as an exaltation is also performed at the end of the consecration of the nave.

Turning to the East, the priest shall say:

Bishop: To the <u>One</u> – angels serve, **Response:** Holy <u>are</u> – You, O God!__

Bishop: To the <u>One</u> – cherubim bless, **Response:** Holy <u>are</u> – You, Al<u>mighty!</u>

Bishop: To the <u>One</u> - seraphim hallow, **Response:** Holy <u>are</u> - You, <u>Immo</u>rtal

Bishop: O Sinners, with repentance, entreat say`ing:____ **Response:** O Christ, who was crucified for us sinners,___

have mer<u>cy on</u> us!

Turning to the West:

Bishop: To the <u>One</u> – fiery hosts praise, **Response:** Holy <u>are</u> – You, O God!__

Bishop: To the One - spiritual beings exalt,

Response: Holy are - You, Almighty!

Bishop: To the <u>One</u> – mortals worship, **Response:** Holy <u>are</u> – You, <u>Immo</u>rtal

Bishop: Children of the faithful Church, entreat say`ing:___ **Response:** O Christ, who was crucified for us sinners,__

have mercy on us!

Turning to the North:

Bishop: To the One - whom the heavens praise,

Response: Holy are - You, O God!__

Bishop: To the <u>One</u> - those between exalt, **Response:** Holy are - You, Almighty!

Bishop: To the One - praised below on earth,

Response: Holy are - You, Immortal

Bishop: O Sinners, with repentance, entreat say`ing:____ **Response:** O Christ, who was crucified for us sinners,___

Then the bishop and priests move toward the place where the stones are to be laid as the foundation for the new church temple.

During this time the following hymn may be sung.

(Hwi Loh Lnafesh - Reesh Qolo)

Bless`ed is He, who built the Holy <u>Church</u> on His hands And placed as her foundation the pro<u>phets</u>, apostles, And the martyrs.

He filled her with all peoples who offer - praise by <u>night and</u> day.

He glorified the prophets, apostles, and martyrs,

And placed their bones within His Church to <u>serve</u> as lanterns. Bless'ed is He

Who exalts their memories; may their prayers - be with us always!

Bless`ed are you, O Church, for the Son's <u>voice</u> protects you;
The doors of She`ol shall never prev<u>ail</u> against you,
For He gave you
His Holy Body and Blood to nourish – and sanctify you! *Barekmor*.

The bishop places the large stone under the altar, saying the following:

Bishop: This stone is laid as the foundation of this church, which is instituted in the name of Saint (*Name*)...

...In the name of the † Father, and of the † Son, and of the † Holy Spirit!

People: Amin.

The following hymn may be sung while the twelve stones are placed.

(Paradayso – Seventh Tone)

See who comes, O <u>Church</u>, in joy to your feast:
The slain apostl<u>es</u> you <u>are</u> founded on,
With Zachari<u>ah</u>, killed <u>on</u> your altar,
The head of John, which became an off'ring_,
And the multitud<u>es</u> of <u>all</u> the martyrs;
For they gave their blood for your building up!

Laying the stones in their respective places, the bishop says the following:

Bishop: This stone is laid as the foundation of the temple of God...

...In the name of the † Father, and of the † Son, and of the † Holy Spirit!

People: Amin.

The Order of the Blessing and Laying of the Foundation Stone is completed.

CONSECRATION of the TEMPLE of GOD

After the prayer of the third hour in the morning the bishop and all the clergy shall be vested and begin this service in the sanctuary of the new church temple. This service may also be conducted after evening prayer, and the first Divine Liturgy on the newly consecrated altar shall be offered in the morning following.

King Solomon's dedication of the Temple (1 Kings 8) serves as the model for the consecration of Christian church temples. But the service of consecration offers further significance to the worshiping community beyond the dedication of the physical building to God: The Church, which is the people of God united in the Body of Christ, "manifests herself as the beloved of Christ, and she proclaims His good news to the world. The liturgy of [consecration] reminds and instructs the faithful to purify themselves, and to reconfirm their relationship with God," sa individuals and as the worshiping community of the Church.

THE FIRST SERVICE

Introductory Prayer

Lord our God, make us worthy to enter into Your courts with purity, move within Your temple with righteousness, approach Your sanctuary with worthiness, obtain Your gifts with sanctity, and to consecrate this altar through Your sanctifying Spirit. May it become fit for administering Your mysteries, and may we offer spotless sacrifice here in this place. O Lord, cleanse us from all stains. We offer praise and thanksgiving to You and to Your Holy Father and to Your Holy Spirit, now and always and forever. Amin.

This was fulfilled when the Church that was established on the Rock was nourished by the Holy Spirit with the spiritual fountain of true doctrines. David spoke of this Church as "the one beautified by inner spiritual ornaments."

This was built with royal garments and the holy baptism, not like the tent of the old covenant which was made of red-colored fur and leather. This was built with spiritual chains and the majesty of the Holy Spirit, not with the cloud- and blood-colored thread. This is supported not by columns of brass and iron but by the prophets, who see the invisible things; and the apostles, who preach the truth; and by the martyrs, who are Christ's followers. This is not the prefiguration of the altar, which was sprinkled upon by the blood of sheep and lambs, but it is the divine and spiritual altar whereon the blood of the blameless Lamb of God is administered. This is not illumined by the seven lamps that lighted the crowd, but by the Sun of justice and by the morning stars that were inspired by the Holy Spirit. The prophets prefigured this Church. Moses, the head of the prophets prefigured her by the tent of the Israelites. Solomon, the ocean of wisdom, saw her in advance. Isaiah, the glorious among prophets, said, "Awake, your light has drawn near! The Lord's light will shine upon you." David sang, "Forget your people and the house of your father, for the king has desired your beauty." Much is written about this Church. Her eyes have become red. Her garments are bright. There are many that praise her. Her architects are wise. Her children are sons and daughters of the King. Her mysteries are hidden and her operations are incomprehensible. The Lord of the universe is her bridegroom. John the Baptist is her servant. Prophets are her guests. Apostles belong to her bridal party. Martyrs are her guests. Her wedding feast took place in darkness and under the cloud. She is hallowed by the Father, extolled by the Son, and protected by the Holy Spirit. Gentiles enter her and sing praise. Along with them do we also cry aloud, "Lord, remember Your Holy Church and elevate her tower of salvation!" May eternal tranquility remain in her. May enriched peace guide her. By Your grace, grant courage to our blessed pastors, motivation to the administrators, righteousness to the leaders, justice to the judges, unity to the priests, purity to the deacons, acceptable repentance to the sinners, and blessed memory to the faithful departed. May You, and Your Father, and Your living Holy Spirit be praised by all, now and always and forever.

PRAYER

Bishop: O Lord, while You are glorified by the incorporeal hosts, You are pleased to be praised by the mouths of the earthly multitudes. O Lord, who are more holy than all holy ones, sanctify us and our temple with the holiness that sets out from You. Make us perfect with Your mysteries. Make us worthy of Your service in order to praise You and Your Father and Your living Holy Spirit with rational mouths, and with tongues that narrate Your divine attributes, now and always and forever!

LITANY

Archdeacon: Let us stand well with fervor, and in voice pleasing to God cry aloud and say, "Lord, have mercy!"

People: Kurielaison! (*Lord, have mercy!*)

Archdeacon: Christ our God, who were pleased to become high

priest and redeemer for us, we beseech You:

People: Kurielaison!

Archdeacon: O Lord, who are the spotless Lamb of God and who made the life-giving cross an adorable altar, and sanctified it with Your blood, and offered Yourself as a perfect sacrifice to Your Father, we beseech You:

People: Kurielaison!

Archdeacon: O Lord, who commanded to sanctify the altar of the tent with the blood of goats and with different kinds of lavations, and who were pleased to sanctify the real spiritual altar of the New Covenant with the Holy Spirit, and the priesthood, and the Holy Chrism, we beseech You:

People: Kurielaison!

Archdeacon: O Lord, who in the past sent fire upon the altar of Elijah, and who now sends life to this altar, and sends the grace of the Holy Spirit who is consubstantial with You, we beseech You:

People: Kurielaison!

Archdeacon: For peace in the Church, for sanctification of this sanctuary and temple, for the living and departed fathers of the Church, for all the living and departed parents, brothers and sisters, we beseech You:

People: Kurielaison!

Archdeacon: Let us cry aloud three times: **People:** Kurielaison! Kurielaison! Kurielaison!

(Lord, have mercy! Lord, have mercy! Lord, have mercy!)

Upon completion of the Litany, the people should repeatedly chant "Kurielaison" if the bishop is still completing the following silent prayer.

Bishop (*Silent Prayer*): O God our Redeemer, You expressed Your love of humankind in various ways. You arranged Your Church with perfect wisdom and spiritual prudence. You arranged the priestly order to resemble the service of the heavenly angels. You liberated Your creation from the deception of Satan and from vain worship. You made it worthy of worshipping You, who are the only sovereign God. Lord, our King, accept our supplication on behalf of this temple. We are unworthy to perform this; it is the outpouring of Your grace that performs this rite (of consecration). Help us and show us Your mercy. You helped us in many ways through our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ, Your Only Begotten Son. He observed the will of His Father, and offered Himself as a pure sacrifice. He granted absolution to the entire world through His crucifixion and death and His resurrection after the third day as foretold. Even after His resurrection and ascension, He did not leave his disciples. He sent to them the Holy Spirit, who is the Comforter. This real Spirit proceeds from the Father and receives from the Son. From the very beginning the seers and ministers of the Word were filled with this Spirit, and through their gifts built Churches and erected altars. They determined the baptism of adoption, precepts of the Covenant, and the order of rites. They entrusted the priesthood to us to offer the sacrifice offered by Christ as oblation and to perform the other mysteries. Therefore, as instructed by them we perform this service and offer supplications to You, O God the Father, and to Your Only Begotten Son, and to Your Living Holy Spirit, and beseech You: sanctify completely, Lord, this altar with Your gracefilled Chrism, the spiritual and divine Myron. On account of this anointing may the oblation be performed as a bloodless and worthy sacrifice on this altar. We stand in this sanctuary of the throne of Your Kingdom, and pray for ourselves and all Your people: may we receive the sacred body of our Lord Jesus and the lordly blood shed for us. Amin.

Bishop (Aloud): O Lord, through Your Holy Spirit, perfect this priestly function which we have already begun. Make this altar a permanent table suitable for the administration of Your heavenly mysteries. Make this sanctuary a harbor of comfort for those who are afflicted, and a place that controls thoughts and deeds that flow from grace, a place of liberation from sins committed knowingly and unknowingly, and an institution of deliverance from offensive actions through our desire for righteous deeds. O God, You and Your Only Begotten Son and Your Holy Spirit are worthy of adoration always. To You, the Triune One, belong glory, honor, and dominion, now and always and forever.

People: Amin.

The people should repeatedly chant "Kurielaison" while the bishop silently prays.

Bishop (Silent Prayer): O God, Lord of all creation and creator of all beings, who move everything for the help and salvation of all human races, and who established the depths and laid the foundation of earth upon purity, in all countries and cities You erected Your churches. You raised altars and ordered the oblations and spotless spiritual sacrifices to be offered on them. Now, O Lord, because of Your love for us, send down Your Holy Spirit. Perfect this altar for the salvation and faithful hope of those who approach You, and for the renewal of our bodies, spirits, and souls.

Bishop (*Aloud*): Because You only are truly compassionate, long-suffering, and rich in grace, glory and thanksgiving are due unto You, O Father, Son and Holy Spirit, now and always and forever.

ANOINTING OF THE ALTAR WITH HOLY CHRISM

The bishop holds the bottle of Holy Chrism (Myron) and ceremoniously elevates it, turning to east, west, north, and south, saying:

Bishop Halleluyah! People: Halleluyah!

After this elevation, the bishop anoints the altar with Holy Chrism three times along the same lines he has previously drawn over the altar without Chrism.

First Signing

Bishop: In the Name of the Father †...O Lord, sanctify this altar by thy sacred hand, and dwell upon it forever. Halleluyah!

People: Halleluyah! (Repeatedly)

Second Signing

Bishop: In the Name of the Son *†*...More favorably than Your beloved ones, Your God has anointed You with the oil of gladness (*Ps.* 45:7). Halleluyah!

People: Halleluyah! (Repeatedly)

Third Signing

Bishop: In the Name of the Holy Spirit †... Glory be to the Father, and to the Son, and to the Holy Spirit, both now and ever, and unto the ages of ages. Amin. Halleluyah!

People: Halleluyah! (Repeatedly)

Then the bishop signs on the altar without Holy Chrism saying the following prayer.

Bishop This altar, which has been anointed with Holy Chrism, is sealed for life eternal: In the name of the Father † and in the name of the Son † and in the name of the Holy Spirit † now and always, and forever and ever.

People: Amin.

The above service is also used to consecrate any tablet(s) for the altar.

(Lord, have mercy! Lord, have mercy! Lord, have mercy!)

The people should repeatedly chant "Kurielaison" while the bishop silently prays.

Bishop (*Silent Prayer*): Lord God of hosts, we thank You for the grace which was given to the apostles and to the fathers, and which was not denied to us but was graciously and compassionately granted us. Though we are still unworthy, make our prayers efficacious for us and for all those mentioned in our prayers. Therefore, O Lord, Your name, along with those of Your Father and Your Holy Spirit, which are more honorable than all, will be glorified, now and always and forever. Amin.

Bishop (Aloud): O Lord, make us worthy to stand before You in purity and holiness and offer the bloodless living sacrifice over this altar, which was consecrated with piety. May this be not for our punishment or condemnation, but for the building up of the Holy Church, for the growth and prosperity of Your people, and for the glory and exaltation of Your Kingdom. Your name, along with those of Your Father and the Holy Spirit, which is glorious, are worthy of adoration and praise, now and always and forever.

CONCLUDING PRAYER

Bishop Christ our Lord, who are the true high priest, You adorned the Holy Church with all spiritual and holy ornaments. You filled her with the gifts of the Holy Spirit. You exalted her with the holy mysteries. Now, O Lord, extend Your right hand and bless Your people. Pour forth Your grace upon the people who supplicate before You. Give Your glorious gifts to the worshippers who stand with devotion before Your altar, which was blessed through our mediation. Help them to sing along with the angels spiritual hymns and songs unceasingly. With Your power help our pastors. Decorate the priests with Your truth. Bless the deacons with Your affection. Lead the sub-deacons with Your right hand. Strengthen the readers with compassion. Illumine the cantors with Your light. Purify the celibates with Your support. Calm the married with Your grace. Teach the youth Your way of piety. Uphold the elderly who call upon You. Protect the orphans with mercy. Feed the poor from Your treasury. Comfort the widows who are dependent on You. Raise the depressed who rely on Your strength. Give aid to the oppressed who take refuge in You. Have mercy upon those beaten who see You as their hope. Bless the young, sanctify the children, and give growth to infants and strengthen them. Straighten those who have gone astray. Protect women and liberate the bound. With hope Your Holy Church offers glory and thankgiving to You, to Your Holy Father, and to Your Holy Spirit, now and always and forever.

The bishop blesses and exalts the altar linens, candle stands, and other items pertaining to the altar, saying the following three times:

Bishop: For the glory, honor, praise, and exaltation of the Holy Trinity, one in essence, and for the tranquility and building up of the Holy Church of God!

Bishop (Silent Prayer): Lord God, the author of all spiritual, material, and visible creation, and the creator of all celestials, terrestrials, and subterrestrials, the Church that ministers You, Your Only Begotten Son, and your Holy Spirit You have perfected like the first-born inscribed in the heavenly Church. Even now, O Lord, send Your blessing and sanctify this temple to become suitable for the worship of Your name, which is most honorable among all. May the prayers offered in this temple bear fruit. When Your people do virtuous acts and offer oblations and first-fruits, and beseech blessing in this place, may they receive salvation and remission of sin and be illuminated in indestructible wisdom. May they receive good counsel and share it with others. May they receive eternal bliss through Your Holy Spirit and overcome sorrow and obtain eternal beatitude. When they do good acts for this temple, inscribe their names in heaven. May Your righteous ones rejoice over the sheep that flock to this place, and be aware of Your presence here, and bless You, now and always and forever. Amin.

Bishop (Aloud): O Lord, we pray and beseech You: fulfill the word uttered by Your mouth. Fulfill Your sacred promises. May Your Holy Spirit dwell here and perform what is necessary. May the words of the gospel become meaningful in the rites and prayers offered in this place. May the grace, mercy, and compassion of our Lord and God and Savior Jesus Christ, Your Only Begotten Son, help us obtain this petition. With Him, You and Your Holy Spirit are worthy of glory, honor, and dominion, now and always and forever.

People: Amin.

Bishop: Peace be unto you to all. **People**: And with your spirit.

The people should repeatedly chant "Kurielaison" while the bishop silently prays.

Bishop (Silent Prayer): O King and Savior, holy maker and creator of all, You deposited the seed of wisdom with human nature, so that human beings could develop tools, arts, and useful reason, and do away with irrational thoughts and our lives pertaining to animals. You provide rational knowledge to protect us from hardships due to heavy rains and severe drought. Although You do not lack anything, accept these congregants who glorify You by making this temple for the purpose of priestly worship and services. You demand us to worship and serve You, not because You lack anything or need anything, but in order that those who offer worship may attain growth and prosperity. Long ago, You gave spiritual wisdom to Bezalel to build a tent for Moses. You protected the people who were traveling across the desert, and sanctified them when the tent was blessed. Now, O Lord, by Your mighty hand bless, sanctify, and protect this holy priestly temple, which we consecrate on Your behalf for the purpose of singing praises to You, now and always and forever. Amin.

Bishop (*Aloud*): O Lord, we rejoice in Your priestly precepts, divine operation, and celebration of Your heavenly and aweinspiring mysteries; and we offer glory and thanksgiving to You, O Father, Son, and Holy Spirit, now and always and forever.

People: Amin.

When the bishop and clergy move around the temple to anoint the walls, the clergy and deacons shall carry lighted candles, fans, the book of the gospel, a container with Holy Chrism (Myron), and the censer. The areas of the nave to be anointed are: the three walls (east, north, and south) of the sanctuary; the east walls of the nave near the sanctuary; above the main doors and/or windows of both walls of the nave; above the main door on the west wall of the nave; inside the baptismal font; and other important areas of the walls as needed.

ANOINTING OF THE WALLS

The bishop now anoints the walls of the nave (hayklo) with Holy Chrism and prays:

Bishop: Christ our God, bless us who are weak and this temple through the prayer of Your mother, Mary the Theotokos, and Saint (*Name*), because Your name, along with that of the Father and of the Holy spirit, is blessed, now and always and forever... [**People**: *Barekmor*]

...In the name of the † Father, and of the † Son, and of the † Holy Spirit.

People: Amin.

During the anointing of the walls the following hymns may be chanted, or the congregation may repeatedly chant "Kurielaison."

O Lord Jesus Christ our God, Through intercession and pray'rs Of Mary, Your pure Mother, Of Your holy Apostles, And of Saint (*Name*), Who protects this, Your temple, Bless us and bless this temple, O Father, Son, and Spirit. Your name is worthy of praise Now, always, and forever!



(Hwi Loh Lnafesh – Reesh Qolo)

Bless`ed is He, who built the Holy <u>Church</u> on His hands And placed as her foundation the pro<u>phets</u>, apostles, And the martyrs.

He filled her with all peoples who offer - praise by night and day.

LITANY

Archdeacon: Let us stand with zeal and cry out, "Lord, have mercy!"

People: Kurielaison!

Archdeacon: Christ our God, who exist in the noblest of places but still are concerned with the lowliest of beings, we beseech you:

Archdeacon: O Lord, whose throne is heaven and whose footstool is earth, and on whom everything is dependent, and who accept those who approach You with faith as your dwelling places, we beseech you:

People: Kurielaison!

Archdeacon: O Lord, who remain in the midst of those who come into this temple made by human hands, in order to honor You, we beseech You:

People: Kurielaison!

Archdeacon: O Lord, who made this temple made by human hands Your dwelling, and who erected the altar in the place of the manger that had received You and in the place of Golgotha where Your cross was raised up, we beseech You:

People: Kurielaison!

Archdeacon: In order for us to be made worthy of seeing Your light in this temple all the days of our lives, we beseech You:

People: Kurielaison!

Archdeacon: So that Your power that hallows all things may hover inside this temple, which was made for Your glory and for the worship of Your holy name, and so that we may become worthy of perceiving well your spiritual operations in this temple through our inner eyes, we beseech You, Christ our God:

People: Kurielaison!

Archdeacon: So that we may become temples of Your Holy Spirit, Christ our true God, we beseech You:

People: Kurielaison!

Archdeacon: Let us cry aloud three times: **People:** Kurielaison! Kurielaison! Kurielaison!

Bishop (*Aloud*): Lord our Good Master, we offer thanksgiving to You and praise Your holy name, which is above all, for all the favors You have granted to us. You have made us worthy to sanctify this priestly temple, which was established for Your glory and for the benefit of our life. Therefore, O Lord, claim this temple, sanctified by us and all people worshiping here, as Your own. May we receive the inheritance of those saved by rejecting worldly desires and evils, and by living a life of righteousness, spiritual maturity, divine submission, and vigilance. Because You are the God who redeems, we offer praise and thanksgiving to You, O Father, Son, and Holy Spirit, now and always and forever.

People: Amin.

The people should repeatedly chant "Kurielaison" while the bishop silently prays.

Bishop (*Silent Prayer*): Our God, remember all those who have brought to this holy temple their harvests, offerings, sufferings, and labors, and all those who are still contributing to this church according to their ability, and reward them with Your abundant gifts.

Bishop (Aloud): O Lord, protect Your devotees by Your divine hosts.

Rescue them from diabolical snares and the deceptions of evil people. Bless the work of their hands and multiply their blessings. Lead them into proper paths that please You.

Eradicate their diseases and debilities. Because You give joy to those who call upon You, and because You are abundant in grace, You, Your Only Begotten Bon, and Your Holy spirit are worthy of honor and dominion, now and always and forever.

PRAYER OF THANKSGIVING

Bishop: Lord God, we give thanks to You for granting us worthiness to bless Your name before Your presence in this temple. We beseech You, defend and protect us from evil strategies of the enemy. Bless this temple by Your benediction. Sustain this for the purpose of offering spiritual thanksgiving. Make us worthy to receive Your awe-inspiring heavenly mysteries. You have willed to make this Your house, and erected this for the glory of Your name; therefore, come and dwell in this place. Protect it, and by the power of the Holy Spirit be the fortress of this temple, now and always and forever.

People: Amin.

Now the bishop takes the same cross meant to be placed on the altar and leads the exaltation of the cross in the four directions of the world. Upon completion of the exaltation, the cross will be placed upon the altar.

have mercy on us!

Turning to the West:

Bishop: To the <u>One</u> – fiery hosts praise, **Response:** Holy <u>are</u> – You, O God!__

Bishop: To the One – spiritual beings exalt,

Response: Holy are - You, Almighty!

Bishop: To the <u>One</u> – mortals worship, **Response:** Holy <u>are</u> – You, I<u>mmo</u>rtal

Bishop: Children of the faithful Church, entreat say`ing:___ **Response:** O Christ, who was crucified for us sinners,__

have mercy on us!

Turning to the North:

Bishop: To the One - whom the heavens praise,

Response: Holy are - You, O God!__

Bishop: To the <u>One</u> - those between exalt, **Response:** Holy <u>are</u> - You, Al<u>migh</u>ty!

Bishop: To the One - praised below on earth,

Response: Holy are - You, Immortal

Bishop: O Sinners, with repentance, entreat say`ing:____ **Response:** O Christ, who was crucified for us sinners,___

have mercy on us!

Turning to the South:

Bishop: Lord, have <u>mercy</u> – upon us **Response**: Lord, be kind – and have mercy

Bishop: Lord, accept our service and our entreaties;__

Have mercy on us

Response: Glory to – You, O God **Bishop:** Glory to - You, Creator

Response: Glory to You, Christ the King, Who has mercy__

upon <u>us si</u>nners. Barekmor.

Our Father, who art in heaven...
